* **Some Photoshop features require a paid upgrade:** Adobe Photoshop Elements is a more basic version of Photoshop with less features, but you can edit full-size images within Elements and crop smaller images without paying for Photoshop. ## Adobe Photoshop Elements The only free version of Photoshop available, _Adobe Photoshop Elements_ is a relatively basic yet powerful image editor. Elements lets you create a variety of digital images, including vector graphics, and manipulate those images with the ability to change their look. You can also use Elements to organize your photos and digital images. Figure 2-3 shows the Elements Photo Bin, an easy-to-use tool for organizing images. FIGURE 2-3: Elements Photo Bin is a simple and easy-to-use tool for organizing and editing your photos. All Elements options available from the Organize menu can also be accessed via the main Organize menu. For example, if you choose the Back and Forward buttons, you see a thumbnail of any image that has been backed up to a disk or to Adobe Bridge, as shown in Figure 2-4. FIGURE 2-4: The Back and Forward buttons enable you to organize, share, and edit your photos. To access the basic editing features, choose Edit⇒Enhance. From the Enhance menu, you can change the look of an image, add special effects, and even remove unwanted objects, as I explain in the following sections. (I discuss digital restoration in Chapter 8.)

In Windows you would go to start > all programs > Adobe > Adobe Photoshop Elements Photo if you installed it correctly. If you installed it correctly, you should be presented with the main, welcome screen for Photoshop Elements. Click on "New" from the menu on the left-hand side. You should see the Welcome to Photoshop Elements screen. Create Click on "Create an

Image" and browse to the folder where you'd like to save the image. The image will be automatically saved in this location, but it does not have to be in the same location as your main folder. You also have the option to choose a location as well, but I haven't tested it. After choosing the location and file name for the new image, you can preview the image or choose to download it to your computer (if you have an internet connection) Create Click on "Download Image" to download the image or choose to put it in your folders. Create When you have uploaded your image, you will be presented with the window below. Create You can now edit the image as you wish. You have some choices: Resize: Click and drag to resize the image. Rotate: Click and drag to rotate the image. Crop: Click and drag to crop the image.
